

WEAPONS TRAINING

Seven 45-60 second briefings in the G.I. Joe PSA tradition — one per weapon in The Watch's arsenal. Each one puts a **Watch unit** on screen to demo its tool, and names the exact **Cabal operative it's super-effective against**. This is the Tool Training every recruit watches before the Five Star Challenge. Learn the weapon, learn the counter, then go aim it.

The master weapon · Threat Assessment Terminal

"Ten seconds tells you if a coin is a trap. This is the tool."

SCRIPT

This is the Threat Assessment Terminal — the master weapon. Paste any Solana contract and The Watch scores it zero to a hundred, then shows the evidence behind the number: is the liquidity locked, are the mint and freeze authorities renounced, can normal wallets actually sell, how concentrated is the supply — and do the early buyers match a known Cabal cluster. That last one is the part nobody else has. Doctor Citex builds his traps at the contract level: honeypots, live mint authority, unlocked pools. The Watch Score reads every one of them and shows its work. It doesn't hand you a verdict to trust on faith — it hands you the doors, and tells you which ones are still open. Red by default. Make the coin earn a green.

ON SCREEN

Commander Zero render + the gold command-table animation (from his channel) · a real capture of the scanner: paste a CA, the gauge sweeps to a score, evidence factors flip green/red · Doctor Citex render (the brain-bot) as the boss being cracked open · big "COUNTERS: DOCTOR CITEX" matchup card.

"Watch the launch open — before the bots finish buying it."

SCRIPT

This is Sentinel — real-time launch scanning. The instant a coin's bonding curve opens, Sentinel is already reading it, logging every wallet that fires in the first fifteen seconds. That window is where Zero Day lives: pre-funded, pre-positioned, seizing supply in the first block before a chart even exists. By the time a normal buyer finds the coin, it's already been captured — and every buyer after is loading the bag the Cabal sells back. Fresh Radar puts you at the door with Sentinel. You watch the opening buyers pile in live and see instantly whether it's organic, or whether a wall of coordinated wallets just took the whole supply in three seconds. You can't un-see who bought first. That's the edge Zero Day never wanted you to have.

The Cabal Database

New face. Same hands.

"This wallet is one day old. It's already rugged forty coins."

SCRIPT

This is Nemesis — the Cabal Database. Phantom's whole trick is disposable wallets: rug a coin, abandon the address, mint a fresh clean one for the next launch, outrun every blacklist. It beats any system that names bad wallets. It does not beat one that reads the pattern. Nemesis maps the crew by behavior and funding, not by address — so when a brand-new wallet shows up funded from the same treasury, moving in the same lockstep, sitting next to the same faces, it inherits the entire Cabal's rap sheet the second it acts like a member. Look a wallet up, and you don't just see what it's done. You see who it runs with, and everything they've done. Phantom can burn a thousand addresses. He can't burn the pattern underneath them.

ON SCREEN

Nemesis render (red) + the cluster-build / CABAL-CONFIRMED stamp animation · a real look-up in /cabal: a wallet resolves into its cluster and launch history · Phantom render dissolving and respawning clean · the recurrence thread snapping the "new" wallets back to one crew · "COUNTERS: PHANTOM" matchup card.

The Wallet Tracker

The disguise changes. The trail doesn't.

"One rug is bad luck. The tenth is a job. Here's how you prove it."

SCRIPT

This is Wraith — wallet tracking across launches. Shape Shifter never runs the same coin twice: fresh launches, new names, cloned tickers, serial deploys built so no two look related. On any single launch he's invisible. Across launches, he's obvious. Wraith follows a wallet from coin to coin and surfaces the recurrence — the same address, or the same tight crew, showing up in the opening window of launch after launch. One appearance is nothing. The same wallet sniping the first block of its fortieth coin is a professional, and now you can see the whole record. Paste a wallet and Wraith lays out every launch it's ever touched. Shape Shifter can change the costume all he wants. He can't change the fact that it's the same hand doing it.

One person paid for all fifty wallets.

"Fifty 'independent' wallets. One person funded every one."

SCRIPT

This is Specter — hidden-relationship analysis. The Broker is the bankroll: he seeds an entire fleet of fresh wallets from one treasury, routes the money through hop wallets to muddy the trail, and every one of those "independent" buyers traces back to him. On the surface they look unrelated. Specter finds the confluence — the shared funding sources, and the coins several tracked actors quietly pile into together — and collapses the crowd back into one hand. It's the tell that survives every rename, because new wallets still have to be funded, and the money always comes from somewhere. When a launch's early buyers all grow from a single root, that's not a community. That's one guy wearing fifty masks, and Specter takes them off.

Specter render (violet) + the confluence-converge animation · a real capture of /confluence surfacing shared-funding links · The Broker render channeling red money streams · a funding graph collapsing dozens of wallets down to one root node · "COUNTERS: THE BROKER" matchup card.

Oracle Forecast

Volume is the easiest number to fake.

"Two million in volume. Zero real buyers. Here's how you tell."

SCRIPT

This is Oracle — the read on what's actually happening. Cyren manufactures momentum: the Cabal's own wallets buy and sell to each other, the same SOL circling in a loop, printing volume with no outside buyer behind it. On the trending page it looks alive. It's a puppet show. Oracle nets every wallet out — cancels the round-trips, strips the wash — and shows you the organic flow underneath, which is usually almost nothing. Then it reads the tape for what it really is: bounce or freefall, real demand or a staged pump. Volume is the number retail trusts most, so it's the one Cyren fakes hardest. Oracle is how you stop trusting the number and start reading who's actually there — which, on her coins, is nobody.

Aegis Alerts

The warning lands before the pull.

"The warning goes out before the pull — not after."

SCRIPT

This is Aegis — the retail warning network. The Rugger's job is the exit: when a coin has taken all the SOL it's going to, he pulls the liquidity or dumps the pre-loaded bag, and the token flatlines in one transaction. He doesn't need a reason. He needs the keys. Aegis is the broadcast layer — it runs the Watch Score across live launches around the clock and pushes the graded, high-risk ones straight to your feed, before you go looking, before the pull. Follow The Watch on Telegram and the alert lands in your pocket: the score, the top evidence, the drain doors still open. You don't have to be at the terminal. Aegis stands watch so you can look up and already know which ones the Rugger's got his hand on.

THE FINAL BOSS

The Cabal Leader

He doesn't snipe, code, wash, or pull — he **coordinates** the ones who do. There's no single weapon for the Leader, because he isn't a single tactic; he's the hand on all of them. You don't beat him with one tool. You beat him by **running the whole loadout** — every unit, every counter, together, on every launch. That's what enlistment is: not a gadget, a doctrine. Master the seven, and the Leader has no move left that The Watch can't already see coming.
